Hockey is part of Canadian culture.

Curriculum

5vs5 The Canadian City Challenge has direct links to the Ontario Education Curriculum Objectives. Other provinces and territories should have very similar objectives.

Reading

The game is intended for players 8 years old and up because reading is necessary for game play.

5vs5 has playing cards containing hockey concepts and pertinent vocabulary. The game board itself also contains reading material, hockey situations and directions for play.

Eight (8) Canadian city team cards are included in the game. Team cards display geographical information on 128 other Canadian cities, provinces and territories and can be ordered for a minimal cost. Customized city tables also available on request. Pupils are encouraged to visit the websites of the Canadian cities involved for more information, tourist attractions, way of life and other interesting material.

Geography

Each city team card contains geographical concepts associated with curriculum objectives. (Grade 2-8)

- Country, provinces, territories, cities

- Capitals of each province, territory

- Geographical location from important cities

- Mileage between important cities

- Maps of Canada, provinces and territories available from Geo-access

City Tables could become the basis for intramural tournaments. Cities can be regrouped by provinces, territories or regions. Pupils can represent cities from western, northern, central and eastern Canada.

Mathematics

5vs5 contains specific dice used in a very special way. The 5 white dice represent the 5 hockey players on a team. Rolling the dice determines the number of goals scored.

This has a direct link to Mathematics and Probabilities.

Pupils can use the game for scoring probabilities.

Ex. How often would a player roll 10 goals, 9 goals, etc. with 5 dice. How often would a player roll 8 goals, 7 goals, etc. with 4 dice etc.
